Elective courses are divided into three categories as Departmental Electives, Area Electives and Non-Area Electives.

The total number of elective courses that must be taken in Political Science and International Relations 2018 curriculum is **10 (ten)**.

You may find the rules and a summative table pertaining to elective courses below:

1- Departmental Electives:

- **At least 6 (six) courses** must be Departmental Elective with PSI code.
- It is possible to take more than 6 (six) Departmental Elective courses with PSI code. However, students can take 8 (eight) PSI electives at most.

2- Other Electives:

- **There are 2 (two) Area Elective courses. These courses must have at least 5 (five) ECTS credits.** The courses having BAF, ECON, INTT, MAN or PSY, TINS, ELL codes can be selected by the students. (The Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences, The Department of Psychology, The Department of Translation and Interpreting Studies, The Department of English Language and Literature). It is necessary to consult academic advisors or the faculty members teaching the course before taking these courses.

- It is possible to take Departmental Elective courses with PSI code instead of Area Elective courses.
- **There are 2 (two) Non-Area Elective courses. At least 1 (one) of them should be taken from Inter-Curricular Courses Department. Language courses**, courses with CEC code, fine arts and sports courses (THEA, PES, MUS) are included. Students have the option of taking one course with HIR code.
- There is no precondition for language courses.

The summary of the distribution of 10 elective courses is below:

<i>6 elective courses (6 ECTS credits)</i>	<i>- Departmental Elective with PSI code (8 PSI at most)</i>
<i>2 elective courses (5 ECTS credits)</i>	<i>- BAF, ECON, INTT, MAN or PSY, TINS, ELL courses (The Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences and The Faculty of Art and Sciences) - or Departmental Electives with PSI code</i>
<i>2 elective courses</i>	<i>► At least one course from Inter-Curricular Courses Department (THEA, PES, MUS, CEC or language courses) should be taken - 1 course from Inter-Curricular Courses Department + 1 course with HIR code - or 2 courses from Inter-Curricular Courses Department can be taken</i>

Note: In order for bachelor's degree to be compatible with ECTS system, 240 ECTS credits must be collected in total.
