Elective courses are divided into two categories as Departmental Electives and Non-Departmental Electives. You may find the rules and a summative table pertaining to elective courses below:

Departmental Electives:

- According to Politics 2012 curriculum, the student must take 12 (twelve) elective courses. At least 4 (four) of them must be Departmental Elective with PSI code.
- It is possible to take more than four Departmental Elective courses with PSI code.

Non-Departmental Electives in Politics 2010 and 2012 Curriculums:

- It is possible to take Departmental Elective courses with PSI code instead of Non-Departmental Electives.
- **Only 2 (two)** of the Non-Departmental Elecitves can be courses with THEA, PES or MUS code.
- There is no precondition for language courses. All of them can be taken.
- All courses with CEC code can be taken.

- Any course, must or elective, opened by The Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences, or from Psychology, Translation and Interpreting Studies, English Language and Literature in The Faculty of Arts and Sciences can be taken as Non-Departmental Electives. It is recommended to consult academic advisors or the faculty members teaching the course.

Note: Do not forget that a great majority of the courses taken from Inter-Curricular Courses Department have 3 credits. In order for bachelor's degree to be compatible with ECTS system, 240 ECTS credits must be collected in total.
